The WSUK Family Support Co-Ordinators (FSC) work with families with children and young people affected by WS, to provide information, support and advice. The FSC also helps families attend the multidisciplinary clinic at Waterfall House Rare Disease Centre at Birmingham Children's Hospital.

When a young person transitions to the Adult Service at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, the support is provided by the WSUK Adult Support Co-Ordinator (ASC).
