




Facilities at the Hospital and Floorplans

Map from hotel to Waterfall House




Ground Floor plan of Birmingham Children's Hospital

In addition to the play area, sensory and quiet rooms in the Rare Disease Centre, there are:

MATRON'S GARDEN

Just along the rainbow corridor (the main corridor to access appointments the main hospital) is a red door which leads to a sensory garden called Matron's Garden. Families can use this space anytime for some fresh air.

SENSORY GARDEN

This is next to Outpatients on the ground floor and has been designed to provide a warm and inviting space for families.

PLAY CENTRE

The Play Centre has a multi-sensory area with lots of amazing lights, and a relaxation area. It also has games, toys and art materials. There's an outdoor playground including a decking area where grown-ups can relax, which is open 24/7. It is located on the ground floor, next to the Clinical Research Facility (CRF).

CHAPEL, MULTIFAITH AND MUSLIM PRAYER ROOM

These are all located on the First Floor

RESTAURANT

This is located at Basement Level - at the far end of the Rainbow corridor in the main hospital building.

THE CONSERVATORY CAFÉ

The hospital café has snacks and seating. It's to the right of the CRF and up the stairs in the main building.

CAFÉ

There is a café serving a small selection of drinks and snacks in the entrance area of Waterfall House.

Free and Discounted Services at BWC

Free Clean Air Zone Voucher & Discounted Parking if attending Birmingham Children's Hospital. Discounts apply at NCP and B4 car parks. Go to the Welcome Desk, near Main Entrance.

Discounted Restaurant and Café Meals ask the ward manager or interpreters at Birmingham Children's Hospital for a Family Discount Card offering 15% discount on freshly prepared food.

Hospital Travel Costs Scheme if you are on welfare benefits you can claim public transport or mileage costs. Go to the Cashiers Office at Birmingham Children's Hospital or Birmingham Women's Hospital.

Free Parent Accommodation at both hospitals for you to stay, if you have a very ill child in hospital. Call 0121 333 8450.

Free knitted items our Charity Knitters can offer free clothing/blankets for babies and toddlers.*

Free transport to your hospital appointment. If you are struggling with the costs of attending our hospitals we can help.*

Free meals for parents if you are finding it difficult to afford meals whilst a child you look after is in hospital - we can offer a free meal deal at lunchtime. CAB can also refer you to your local foodbank*

*Offers limited to relieving financial pressures subject to availability. Citizens Advice will refer you directly for this free support whilst you await a Welfare Benefits or Grants check.
